Key insights from wānanga tables - oral

THE RIGHT INFORMATION, THE RIGHT PEOPLE

This is all connected with the right people with the right skills to teach our young people what our old people know.

- Connection with our whānau, those who are overseas
- A free service
- Having succession workshops in high schools to teach our young ones

WELL FUNDED SERVICE WELL TRAINED STAFF

Something that started in 1900 is creating a problem for us today.

Any organisation that is created should be well funded with trained staffed.

This is a beast that the government has created and they need to make sure it is managed and funded properly.

Staffing wise, they need to be knowledgeable, respectful, and knowledgeable of tikanga and kawa.

No jargon, we all want to understand the process. This comes through well trained staff knowing what to do.

A KAUPAPA MĀORI ORGANISATION

Our priority was governance with integrity. There is a lack of integrity and trust amongst trustees. We need to be able to trust the people we put in charge, to ensure the mana of the hapu and whanau is maintainted.

We are thinking a kaupapa Māori organisation. We need governance training from a Māori perspective framework.

SUPPORT/ MANAAKITANGA FOR LAND UTILISATION

We focused on the values of an organisation and an organisation that is fit for purpose.

Planning education from start to implementation including:

- · Business plans
- Advice
- · Capacity building
- Funding
- Resources

An organisation that is innovative and creative and semi autonomous from the crown.

We see a future for moke who are still living off the benifit of this taonga. The full well being of economic, socail and cultural.

No separation of whenua to water.

Create jobs. Ensure that we get through the education pipeline. Bring our rangatahi home.

CLEAR PROCESSES AND GOOD TRAINING FOR CUSTOMERS

Clear processes and good training and education for customers in relation to land development. Know our options.

If these things are done well, everything else will fall into place.

EDUCATION BUILD CAPACITY & CAPABILITY

A key theme for us was education. Not just governance, but also educating whānau on how to navigate the system. Education is power!

Realising our economic opportunities of our whenua. Some of us don't know what we can do.

How do we preserve whakapapa and history that are currently held within the minutes of the Māori Land Court.
