

Build champions with particular skills


- Land development

Build and use the skills and knowledge of this town - people, networks and businesses.


To have a successful outcome, profit and retain whenua - we need funding.

HAPU BASED MĀORI LAND SERVICE


We want the service to be responsive to our needs. It is our land - we need to be doing it. We need our young ones doing it with us, we need resources and we need help.




ACCURATE UP TO DATE INFORMATION

A data base of land owners with accurate and up to date information. Without this information we have nothing.

- A one stop shop to do with whenua, with multiple points of access
- A list of mediators for whānau to choose from, someone who can bring calm and peace to the iwi
- · Organisational ability to deliver the services
- The success of the service depends on MLS delivering what we need for whenua
- MLS being independent by Māori, for Māori and using our existing networks to deliver the service.

SUCCESSION


Māori owned and managed by Māori in our communities.

Succession is a complicated process and needs to be simplified for straight forward succession and for all ages.

We need a service that is accessible here in Taumarunui. Establish a mobile service that visits whānau/ kaumātua in their homes.

A mobile kiosk at the marae with the same IT technology as mobile banks.

A ONE STOP SHOP


MLS should be a one stop shop for everything about the whenua.

MLS succession application should reverse - instead of naming our tupuna we should name our tamariki and moko. Under the current system we have to put down our whakapapa and some of us don't know past our parents.

We need accessible funding for papakāinga. People can not come home to the land becasue there is nowhere to live.

We need accessible funding where Māori land owners can get loans that do not put whenua at risk with guaranteed rates that we can afford.

FOR US TO BE ABLE TO DO THIS OURSELVES

SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

Our priority is to see it happen for us- our whenua, our hapū, our iwi on our whenua.

For us to be able to do this ourselves. It is our dream, we will action our plans and teach our young ones so they can be self sufficient.

We want the service to be responsive to our needs - it is our land, we need to nuture it ourself with your help.

We need help with resources even if you have to involve outside specialists.

A UNIFIED APPROACH FOR GOVERNANCE AND CAPABILITY

MLS as a communication tool to share resources and information.

Expert knowledge where we need support e.g water.

A Trust that truly represents iwi, hapū and whānau. Trust in ourselves and trust in what is given for us to care for.

Socialising information to let people participate.

Transparency to your people. If you are transparent to your people you are on the way to achieving your strategic goals.

Our people have a saying **Tūturu whakamate, kia mau tonu!**To hold on, until death!
