





Te Puni Kōkiri: Te Waipounamu Regional Profile 2017

The Te Waipounamu region replicates the boundaries of Ngāi Tahu Whānui, the northern points are from Kahurangi Point on the West Coast to Te Parinui o Whiti (White Bluffs) near Kaikōura on the East Coast. The region includes the bulk of the South Island including Rakiura (Stewart Island).







Oranga – Whānau Well-Being & Whānau Housing in Te Waipounamu











