## **Upcoming Activities**

Investing in 13 Whānau Ora partners selected for 'commissioning for collective impact'. Commissioning for collective impact aims to drive social change for whānau across a range of outcome areas. Te Pou Matakana's Whānau Ora partners will be contracted to work with whānau and families throughout Te Ika-a-Māui to identify their priority needs and achieve their priority outcomes.

Committed a portion of its commissioning funding to Whānau Direct, a grants based initiative that provides funding of up to \$1,000 directly to whānau. The aim of the grant is to enable whānau to respond quickly to an immediate need that must contribute to a long-term outcome such as employment, education or health.

An independent evaluation of the Whānau Direct pilot, to better understand how to meet the priority needs of whānau and families in Te Ika-a-Māui, has been completed.
