TEACH WHĀNAU HOW TO GOVERN & PROTECT THEIR LAND

Tailor the service to the needs of the whenua

3 priorities:

1. No cost to us - we provided the korero in the first place why should we buy it back

2. Culturally sensitive staff who know the business, "how can I help you?"

3. Help the people at their level, help them understand what they are comming to ask you, have respect.

Teach whānau how to govern and protect their land and to retain it in the blood line to their people. The whenua is us and we are the whenua. We know what do do, we can do this ourselves. If you want to know what to do, come and ask us.

BUILD CULTURAL CAPITAL

Value local knowledge. Cultural capital – go to local knowledge it is the wealth. Investment ensuring that the knowledge has longevity for generations, is preserved and is enduring.

No local body should be telling us what we have to do and what we can do or mandate.

Discovery of what matters in ensuring that the knowledge is preserved for everyone. How to invest an preserve cultural capital so that it has longevity and is preserved forever. It is present and it is enduring.
