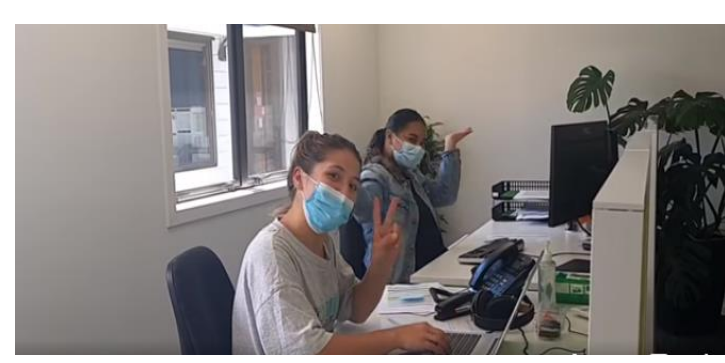

Provider Spotlight: Tūwharetoa ki Kawerau Hauora – Phase 2

MCCF has contracted and fully paid \$0.3m in funding to Tūwharetoa ki Kawerau Hauora to support whānau through COVID-19, in the Kawerau rohe.

Tūwharetoa ki Kawerau Hauora has taken a lead in ensuring whānau within their community have access to appropriate health and social support if they test positive for, or are required to self-isolate due to COVID-19.

The first cases of COVID-19 in the Kawerau community occurred in December 2021 and accelerated significantly in February 2022. Positive cases increased by up to 80 per day at the peak in March 2022. Tūwharetoa ki Kawerau Hauora supported whānau during this time by proactively calling those that had tested positive for COVID-19 and undertaking a health and social support assessment. This assessment would help them to identify any underlying medical conditions and medication requirements and ascertain the need for delivery of kai and medication to each whare.

Supporting whānau at this level required significant resourcing and Tūwharetoa ki Kawerau Hauora has employed temporary staff to support phone calls to whānau, prepare health packs and support home deliveries. At its peak Tūwharetoa ki Kawerau Hauora supported 231 individuals in a week.

The pūtea provided by the MCCF to Tūwharetoa ki Kawerau Hauora has helped them provide support services to 1,607 whānau in their rohe.

Papakura Marae – Approved Phase 3 Proposal

The Omicron Assessment Panel approved this proposal for \$0.266m to enable activities that will support whānau through COVID-19 in Counties Manukau.

Papakura Marae will provide unconditional support and care to whānau experiencing hardship over the period April - June 2022. They will utilise a multipronged approach to Omicron recovery by providing support through the distribution of hygiene packs; preparing vaccination communication materials; providing vaccination support through vaccination drives and supporting whānau suffering from long COVID.

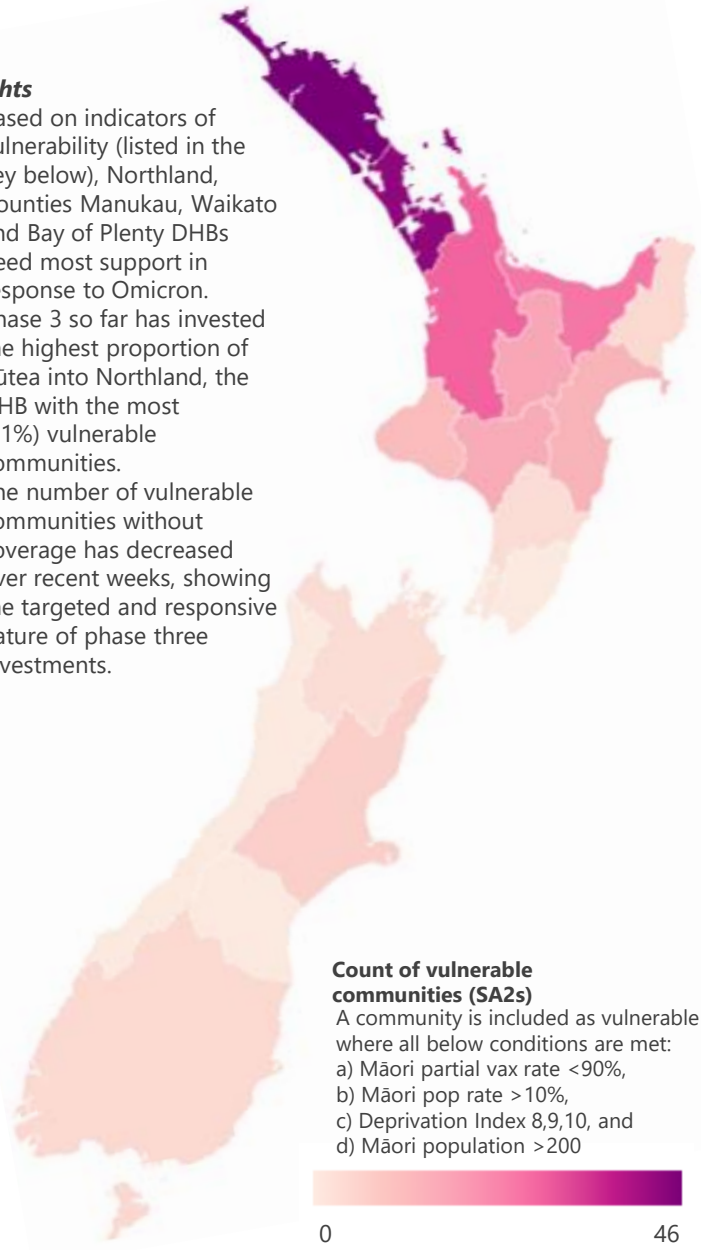
The pūtea provided by the MCCF to Papakura Marae will allow them to provide support to, and build resilience amongst approximately 2,000 whānau affected by COVID-19.

Vulnerable communities by DHB Area May 24th

Insights

- Based on indicators of vulnerability (listed in the key below), Northland, Counties Manukau, Waikato and Bay of Plenty DHBs need most support in response to Omicron.
- Phase 3 so far has invested the highest proportion of pūtea into Northland, the DHB with the most (21%) vulnerable communities.
- The number of vulnerable communities without coverage has decreased over recent weeks, showing the targeted and responsive nature of phase three investments.



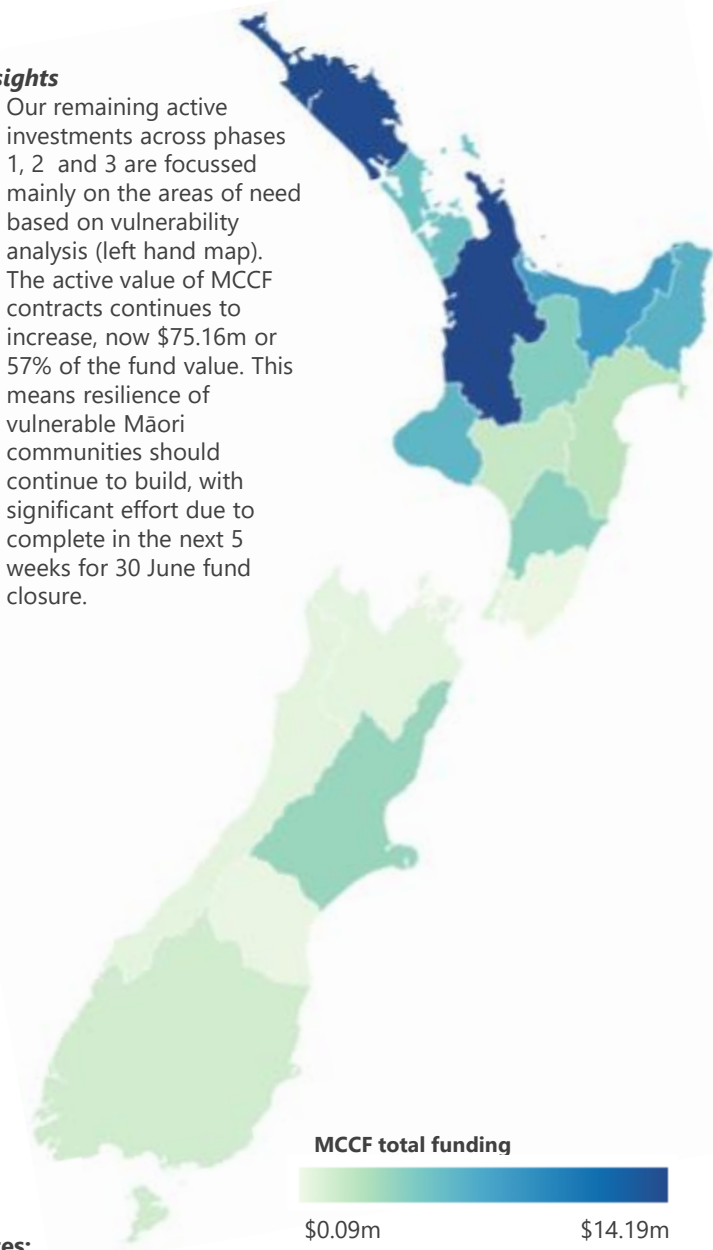

Insights

- Our remaining active investments across phases 1, 2 and 3 are focussed mainly on the areas of need based on vulnerability analysis (left hand map).
- The active value of MCCF contracts continues to increase, now \$75.16m or 57% of the fund value. This means resilience of vulnerable Māori communities should continue to build, with significant effort due to complete in the next 5 weeks for 30 June fund closure.



Notes:

- 'Approved, not yet expired' investments include all approved investments yet to reach the contract end date
- Dollar figures are amounts approved or contracted through MCCF
- Auckland DHBs are aggregated
- Funding share for proposals covering multiple DHBs is based on vaccination rates, and should be considered an estimate

- 'Overseas / Unknown' included in total vaccination percentages
