The below information is a summary of the overall provisional results for the progressive procurement reporting period from 1 July 2021-30 September 2021.*

Overall reporting results

78 agencies awarded new contracts to 260
Māori businesses for the reporting period,
meaning there are 2.4% of contracts and for
an approximate value of \$303 million.


Māori business support

- Engaged with over 400 Māori businesses spanning 25 industries, to raise awareness of government procurement and/or provide support
- 12 Māori businesses receiving targeted capability uplift support – to date several have been successful with approx. \$5million contracts being awarded.


Regional breakdown of Māori business contracts

While there are Māori Business contracts held across the motu, this round of reporting showed most Māori businesses with contracts with government agencies are in Wellington and Auckland.

92.4% of all Māori Business contracts are in the below 10 industries.
