Initial Short-term Response Package to Accelerate Māori Response to Cyclone Gabrielle

Portfolios Māori Crown Relations: Te Arawhiti / Māori Development / Whānau Ora

On 27 February 2023, Cabinet:

- noted that hapori Māori and Māori service providers are supporting communities in response to Cyclone Gabrielle with resources that are heavily stretched;
- 2 noted that interim funding is required to provide support to increase capability and capacity to help hapori Māori with response and recovery;
- noted that the focus of funding in the package outlined in the paper under CAB-23-SUB-0059 is on co-ordination, capability and capacity building for Iwi and Whānau Ora Commissioning Agencies, as well as infrastructure and workforce support;

- noted that reprioritising existing funding on its own is insufficient to support hapori Māori capacity and capability to build the urgent and at-pace response, and additional funding is required;
- noted that the Ministers for Māori Crown Relations: Te Arawhiti, Māori Development, and Whānau Ora are proposing a funding package of \$15 million to support Iwi and Māori-led responses and recovery;
- noted that Te Puni Kōkiri has reprioritised \$5 million, and Te Arawhiti has reprioritised \$1 million of current funding to assist with the response;
- agreed to interim additional funding of \$9 million to support a response package to accelerate the Māori response to Cyclone Gabrielle;
- agreed to delegate decision-making on the reporting and accountability arrangements for the expenditure referred to in paragraph 8 to the Minister of Finance, Minister for Māori Crown Relations: Te Arawhiti, Minister for Māori Development, and Minister for Emergency Management;

Funding implications for Te Puni Kōkiri

approved the following changes to appropriations to give effect to the policy decision in paragraph 8 above, with a corresponding impact on the operating balance and net core Crown debt:
