Thank you for your information request dated 28 January 2024. You asked for the following information:

"The purpose of this OIA is to create an accurate list of GDSs in operation as at 31 December 2023. In order to achieve this, we would like to ask you the following three questions summarised below, but specified in more detail in the Excel attached. The Excel notes by row, (i) all existing GDSs in 31 December 2021 (in blue) or (ii) possible GDSs (in green), found by my team. Our preference is that you answer the questions in the Excel, and email the Excel back to us.

- 1. Are the existing GDSs (as at 31 December 2021) still active?
- 2. Are there any GDSs that are missing from the attached document? If yes please add to the Excel document attached.
- 3. Are there any GDSs that are included in the attached document that have been recently archived (and therefore need to be removed from our list)"?

Your request has been considered in accordance with the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act).

Four Strategies have been identified in scope of your request. Answers to the questions above that relate to these documents have been provided as Attachment 1, in your 'Draft Master Excel Version 147' template as requested.
