## **Official Information Act request**

Thank you for your information request dated 23 December 2024. You asked for the following information:

"Please provide the last 12 months internet history logs showing all the web site addresses that have been accessed using Ministry computers or Internet systems".

Your request has been considered in accordance with the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act).

To meet your request would require a substantial amount of research and collation which would result in a significant and unreasonable impact on our ability to carry out our other operations. I am therefore refusing your request under section 18(f) of the Act.

I have considered whether charging or extending the timeframe for responding to your request would help, as required by section 18A of the Act. I have decided that this will not mitigate the need to collate a large volume of information and will still have a significant and unreasonable impact on our ability to carry out our other operations.

I have also considered consulting with you, as required by section 18B of the Act. However, any refinement to this request will still amount to substantial collation and research.

I trust my response satisfies your request.
