Official Information Act request

Thank you for your information request dated 2 April 2025. You asked for the following information:

"I am seeking, under the Official Information Act 1982, all documents, including advice, papers and communications relating to the reform of the Waitangi Tribunal since October 2023. That includes communications between officials of your ministry, with officials of other government agencies or parliamentary offices, and/or with ministers".

Your request was originally made to the Ministry of Justice. On 17 April 2025, the Ministry of Justice transferred your request to Te Puni Kōkiri for response.

The Ministry of Justice informed Te Puni Kōkiri that you were seeking "information relating to the coalition agreement" and that you were referring to a commitment in the National-New Zealand First coalition agreement to "Amend the Waitangi Tribunal legislation to refocus the scope, purpose, and nature of its inquiries back to the original intent of that legislation"

On 1 May 2025, you clarified your request. You agreed to omit "communications" from your request.

Your request has been considered in accordance with the Official Information Act 1982 (**Act**). We note for clarity that your request covers the period from October 2023, as stated in your request, to 2 April 2025, the date of your original request.

18 documents have been identified in scope of your request. The documents and my decisions with regard to the release of the information are set out in the table attached as **Appendix A**.

Release of information

We are releasing nine of these documents to you as excerpts in accordance with section 16(1)(e) of the Act. These documents are weekly reports provided to Hon Tama Potaka, Minister for Māori Development, by Te Puni Kōkiri on the respective dates for

the week ahead. Our reason for taking this approach is that these documents are voluminous and contain information outside the scope of your request. These excerpts are provided to you as **Attachment One.**

Some information has been withheld in accordance with the Act under section 9(2)(g)(i) to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs though the free and frank expression of opinions by or between or to Ministers of the Crown or members of an organisation or officers and employees of any public service agency or organisation in the course of their duty.

In relation to information that has been withheld under section 9 of the Act, we are of the opinion that there are no countervailing considerations that make it desirable, in the public interest, to make the information available at this time.

The remaining nine documents have been refused in accordance with section 18(d) of the Act. This relates to information that will soon be publicly available, through proactive release. Cabinet papers will be proactively released by Te Puni Kōkiri within 30 business days of final Cabinet decisions.

Minister Potaka has agreed for information on the review of the Waitangi Tribunal Legislation to be proactively released in tranches. This information is to be published on our website on or before 21 May 2025.

We trust our response satisfies your request.

Please note that Te Puni Kōkiri publishes some of its OIA responses on its website, after the response is sent to the requester. The responses published are those that are considered to have a high level of public interest. We will not publish your name, address or contact details.
