Thank you for your information request dated 7 August 2019. You asked for:

 ... the letters of Offer made to all 3 Commissioning Agencies from 2014 through to 2019 inclusive? Six offers over six years in total.

On 20 August 2019, Te Puni Kōkiri contacted you to clarify the scope of your request. You confirmed the request relates to the annual Budget Confirmation Letters sent to the Commissioning Agencies each Financial Year.

On 3 September 2019, Te Puni Kōkiri notified you of an extension of an additional 20 working days to respond to your request to enable additional time for consultation. I am now in a position to respond in full.

Your request has been considered in accordance with the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act).

With regard to your request for information related to the Financial Year (FY) 2014/15, I am advised that Budget Confirmation Letters were not in place at this time. This part of your request is therefore declined under section 18(e) of the Act, which applies when document alleged to contain the information does not exist.

However, I can confirm that prior to the implementation of Budget Confirmation Letters, funding was set out in the Outcome Agreements signed in 2014. Please refer to the information attached as Appendix A, 'Commissioning activity FY 2014/15 indicative payment schedule'. This information has been copied from the Outcome Agreements signed in 2014 and is an accurate reflection of funding provided to Commissioning Agencies for the FY 2014/15. Some information has been withheld under section 9(2)(ba)(ii) of the Act, which applies to protect information that is subject to an obligation of confidence, where the making available of the information would be likely otherwise to damage the public good.

Annual Budget Confirmation Letters for the period FY 2015/16 – FY 2018/19 are attached. Some information has been withheld under section 9(2)(ba)(ii).



The Annual Budget Confirmation Letters for the current FY 2019/20 have been withheld in full under section 9(2)(ba)(ii).

In making the decision to withhold information, I have considered the public interest in accordance with section 9(1) of the Act.

I trust my response satisfies your request.

Please note that Te Puni Kōkiri publishes some of its OIA responses on its website, after the response is sent to the requestor. The responses published are those that are considered to have a high level of public interest. We will not publish your name, address or contact details.

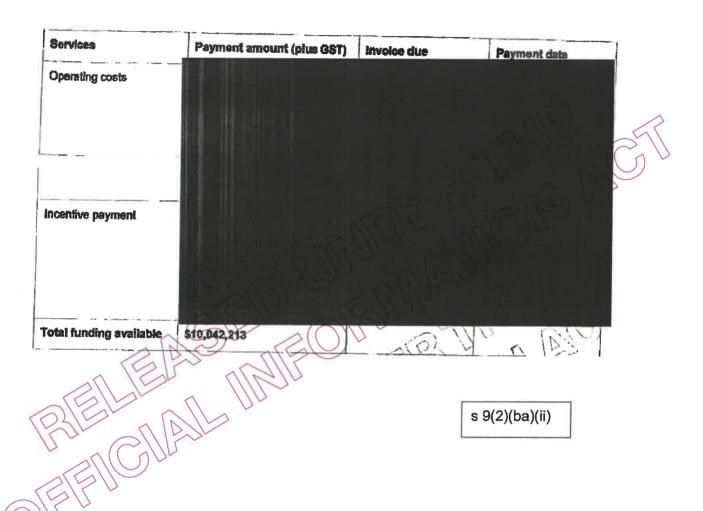

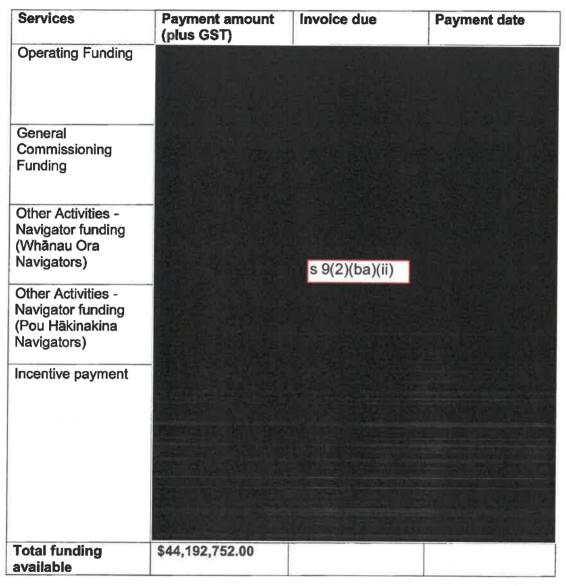

Pasifika Futures: Budget funding for 2016 for FY2016/17

As you are aware, through Budget 2016 the Government has committed an additional \$10 million per annum to expand Whānau Ora commissioning activity to support families. This is in recognition of the meaningful improvements in outcomes for families as a result of Commissioning Agencies' investments to date.

Of this funding, Pasifika Futures has been allocated an additional \$3,328,000 (plus GST) in general commissioning funding for the 2016/17 financial year. This additional funding has been allocated using the updated base allocation model.

With this additional funding, the total annual budget for Pasifika Futures for the 2016/17 financial year is as follows:

Note the quantum of this funding is subject to Commissioning Agencies' contracting with specified providers.
Note this represents 50% of the one-off funding of \$108,000.00 to support the additional work required by Pasifika Futures to establish contractual relationships with providers previously contracted by the Ministry of Social Development. The first payment instalment of the same amount will be distributed in the 2015/16 financial year (see below).

In addition to this, Te Puni Kökiri will distribute additional one-off 2015/16 funding prior to 30 June 2016:

- Additional funding of \$675,270 transferred from Vote Social Development. This has been incorporated into the Outcome Agreement through the variation dated 23 May 2016.
- The first one-off payment of \$54,000 of operating funding to support Pasifika Futures to establish contractual relationships with providers previously contracted by MSD (note that the second one-off payment of \$54,000 of 2016/17 Vote Social Development operating funding will be paid on 4 January 2017 to bring the total amount of funding to \$108,000).

We will continue to work with you to vary our Outcome Agreement to incorporate this additional funding and to reflect the funding in your 2016/17 Annual Investment Plan.

I look forward to seeing the continued achievement of outcomes for families supported by Pasifika Futures investments and to see Whānau Ora making the greatest possible difference for families throughout New Zealand.
