## Te Ture Whenua Maori (Improved Multiple Ownership Issues, and Related Matters) Amendment Bill: Approval for Introduction

On 17 September 2019, the Cabinet Legislation Committee, having been authorised by Cabinet to have Power to Act [CAB-19-MIN-0483]:

- noted that the Bill makes targeted amendments to the Te Ture Whenua Māori Act 1993 that support the Māori Land Court and strengther, the regulatory framework for Māori land tenure;
- 3 agreed that the Bill:
  - extend the scope of the Maori Land Court's power to issue special injunctions to include the 'General Land owned by Māori,' a special category of land that is subject to Act; and
  - 3.2 simplify the process for converting Crown land into Māori customary land;
- 4 noted that Cabinet authorised Te Minita Whanaketanga Māori and the Minister of Justice to approve further minor and technical amendments, if required [MCR-18-MIN-0016];
- 5 **noted** that some minor and technical matters were identified that required Ministerial approval.
- 6 approved the Te Ture Whenua Māori (Improved Multiple Ownership Issues, and Related Matters) Amendment Bill [PCO 21150/] for introduction, subject to the final approval of the government caucus and sufficient support in the House of Representatives;
- agreed that the Bill be introduced by 23 September 2019;
- authorised the Minister of Justice and Te Minita Whanaketanga Māori to make any changes to the Bill, including the Bill's title, considered necessary to achieve its intended purpose during the remaining stages of the legislative process;
