


Healthcare contracts make up almost 40% of contracts awarded to Māori businesses



Contract Categories

- Healthcare sector is the most prominent category in our data collection with 38.4% of contracts awarded.
- Construction sector contracts makes up 2.8% of awarded contracts and has the highest median value (\$600K)
- Education and Training is makes up 14.5% of awarded contracts.
- Management and Business Professionals is the sector with the most agencies awarding contracts (34)
- 23 other sectors make up 19.1% of awarded contracts.

Over 60% of contracts awarded to Māori businesses under \$100k



Value Ranges

- \$10K - \$50K is the most common value range by number of contracts awarded (25.5%). This was also the most common by number of agencies with 71 agencies awarding contracts in this range.
- 22 agencies have awarded contracts with a total value of over \$1M (6.3%).

Over 50% of contracts awarded to Māori businesses were outside Wellington and Auckland

Awards by Region

- 33.7% of all contracts awarded to Māori businesses were in the Wellington region.
- Wellington, Auckland, Bay of Plenty, Canterbury, Otago, Northland and Manawatu-Wanganui each have more than 20 different agencies awarding contracts to Māori businesses.

Spotlight on Te Tai Tokerau Northland

Te Tai Tokerau regularly has a high proportion of all the contracts awarded to Māori businesses. It is an area where lots of agencies are choosing to engage local Māori businesses to carry out mahi that is important to the local community. Healthcare Services, Public Utilities and Public Sector Relations and Building and Facility Construction and Maintenance Services make up almost 75% of all contracts awarded in Te Tai Tokerau.
